Other times, it can actually be an offensive weapon. You know, the cold shoulder of silence.

But when we need to speak, there's a positive duty to talk things out. You've got problems that need to be addressed. You've got to listen. You've got to speak. You've got decisions that need to be made. You've got to listen. You've got to speak. You need to express needs and desires. You've got to communicate that. And yes, sometimes, dissatisfactions, right?

You've got to know when to be silent and listen, as well as when to speak, because no one's telepathic. We can't read minds.
